## Topical tip

The Trading Hut has now sold out of the old, metaldehyde-based slug pellets. These have been replaced with pellets based on ferric phosphate. Whereas metaldehyde-based pellets affect the slug's mouthparts and stops them feeding immediately, resulting in rapid paralysis and death, ferric phosphate-based pellets work more slowly but will also cause the affected slug to stop eating.

Research has shown that slugs eating the ferric phosphate-based pellet will head for darkness, often returning to the soil to die. Hence, with the new slug pellets, you are not as likely to see the evidence of dead slugs. However, the new ferric phosphate pellets are almost as effective as the ones based on metaldehyde and much more environmentally friendly.
