Things to remember

4. Just a reminder that any car parked in the Disabled space must have a Blue Badge. A Blue badge belongs to the person, not the car and so can be in any car where the holder is a passenger.

On Monday's meeting Jan Lowe gave us a talk about the Send-a-Cow Charity.

They work in several African countries to help small farmers grow enough to feed themselves and produce enough to start up small businesses. Small village groups are asked to select someone to go for training, and that person then goes on to train other people. They do not tell people what they should do, but ask "what do you have", and offer advice. The Charity operates the "Pass on Principle"; people are often given seeds, or even livestock, with the promise that at the first harvest they will pass on the same donation to another person.

The main training is in the making of compost; being shown how to make an effective compost heap, waste turns into compost as quickly as 6 weeks near the Equator! Also plant teas, manure teas, and double digging are shown. Crops can be grown all year round.

Bag gardens can be used even on a tiny space. In an old sack a bunch of twigs is placed in the centre, surrounded by soil. Plants are placed in the top and in holes in the side and water and fertiliser poured into the centre. As many as nine plants can be grown this way. Keyhole gardens work on the same principle but are larger and have access to the twigs in the centre. Raised beds are also used.

We were told how the use of these methods helped one family to improve their lives. The father had previously walked 4 hours each way to work for a pittance and had very poor soil in his plot. With what he learned, within 8 months he was growing beetroot, leeks, sweet peppers, carrots sweetcorn, courgettes, tomatoes and lettuce, enough to feed his family, and some to sell. He bought more seeds, medicine, bricks, and shoes so his children could go to school.
